'Meyer' cold hardiness update:

In mid-December, low temperatures around Kansas dipped well below zero.

My colleague Dr. Jack Fry and his PhD student David Okeyo are continuing their studies of cold hardiness in zoysiagrass. They did some sampling during the week of Dec 22, after some of the extreme cold hit. They pulled plugs and put them in the greenhouse.

For those of you with Meyer zoysia, you'll be happy to hear that (at least in our site) the sample plugs of Meyer are showing no signs of injury.
